GP Resilience

Surrey Heartlands CCGs (not including East Surrey) have received £114,000 GP Resilience funding. East Surrey CCG has received £24,799. GP practices will be asked to bid for funding and state how they would utilise the funding to improve their resilience.

Whilst it can be challenging to identify which practices are in most need of resilience funding, the below criteria provides an objective measure to support PCCC to target the funding at those practices who are most in need.

Criteria

The following criteria would be used to assess the bids:

- 1. What evidence is there that the practice requires support?**
 - a. No evidence support required = 0pts
 - b. Some evidence that support is required = 3pts
 - c. Very likely that urgent support is required = 5pts
- 2. What is the likely impact on the practice if support is received?**
 - a. Minimal impact on staff and patients = 1pt
 - b. Moderate impact on staff and patients = 3pts
 - c. Significant impact on staff and patients = 5pts
- 3. CQC Rating**
 - a. Unscored, but consideration should be given by PCCC to any issues that have arisen as a result of a CQC inspection
- 4. Workforce Issues**
 - a. GP vacancies = 1pt
 - b. Nurse vacancies = 1pt
 - c. Other, including non-clinical staff = 1pt
- 5. Other issues known to CCG**
 - a. Unscored, but consideration should be given by PCCC
 - b. Primary Care Dashboard
- 6. Significant planned changes**
 - a. Nearby practice dispersal = 1pt
 - b. Other issues = 1pt
 - c. Proposed merger = 3pts
- 7. Patient access issues**
 - a. Capped list = 1pt
 - b. Closed list = 2pts
- 8. Has practice had resilience funding in the past?**
 - a. Unscored, but consideration should be given by PCCC as to whether previous funding has helped resilience and should be continued

Next Steps

PCCC are asked to approve the above criteria. Bids will be scored by the Primary Care team and brought to a future PCCC meeting for discussion and sign-off.
